
# Valerie

# How to play:

Form two lines, facing each other. Find the numbers 1, 2, and 3 in the song and do the actions that go with each part.

## Part 1

The head of one line struts down the alley between the lines, in whatever way he or she feels like moving. You've got to get to the end of the line by the end of the verse.

#### Part 2

The head of the other line goes down the alley behind Valerie, copying the strut, like the picture on the top right.

### Part 3

The lines come together and opposites hold hands, chugging in and out with their arms and their feet (below, right).

The game continues with a new Valerie each time, until all have had a turn to strut and to copy.
