## Introducing New Members of SIFD

As new members of SIFD, they are exploring and learning new dances, making new friends, broadening their visions of folk dancing, enjoying folk dancing as non-instructors, and experiencing the stress-free atmosphere of Surrey's International Folk Dancing community.

Their SIFD involvement is small, when compared to their impact on the dance communities of Taiwan, Mainland China, South Korea, Vietnam.

In September 1998, they gathered together people who loved to dance—or who just wanted to exercise and to meet people within their community—when they formed an international folk dancing interest group, working with Langley Family Services Association and teaching at Langley's Douglas Recreation Centre and at Surrey's Fraser Heights Recreation Centre. Later, this group became Langley-Surrey International Folk Dancing Interest Group (LSIFDIG)

- Chinese New Year Party at United Chinese Community Enrichment Services Society (S.U.C.C.E.S.S.)
- Surrey's annual Fraser Heights Country Fair.
